

Dear Coal Board Members:


The Northern Cheyenne Ministerial Association received a Coal Board grant to start a thrift store in Lame Deer, MT. The coal board grant was to be used for Architect and Engineering \$28,000.00 and upper level construction (shell only) \$272,000.00. The land acquisition, site preparation, and lower level construction was completed with funds on hand and donated labor. The inside finish work is not done yet, because they are still trying to get funding to finish the inside through Murdock Trust. The portion that the Coal Board funded has been finished. The remaining Coal Board funds of \$6,000.00 are being requested by Rosebud County and Northern Cheyenne Ministerial Association to pay Tom Robinson Construction for work completed and invoiced June 16, 2017.

**RE: Terminating Coal Board Planning Grant Contract MT-CB-PL-15-0745**

Dear Mr. Williams:

On behalf of the Crow Tribe of Indians, I respectfully request to terminate Coal Board Planning Grant Contract MT-CB-PL-15-0745. No additional work on the project will be done at this time. I understand, by terminating the contract, the Tribe is forfeiting \$15,000 in undrawn Coal Board grant funds. As you may recall, the scope of work described in the contract includes the following: architectural, structural, and electrical design of the new dance arbor; electrical design of the vendors circle; preparation of bid documents, including plans and specifications; and construction administration.

The Tribe has decided to delay planning, fundraising, and construction efforts with regard to the new dance arbor. I know there are many needs in Coal Country and the forfeited funds could help bring another project to fruition.

I appreciate the Coal Board's generosity and support of a significant cultural public facility within the Crow community. When the Tribe resumes its fundraising efforts with regard to the new dance arbor, I will be in contact with the Coal Board.

Dear Members of the Coal Board,

Six months ago a coalition was formed in Lodge Grass to begin community transformation work. A 12-member professional leadership team was formed and we were awarded a \$60,000 planning grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to receive mentoring in human centered design. We then engaged in research and evaluation to determine strategies that would be supported by the community to begin making significant changes to our town. We are currently prototyping plans for educational, economic, and structural changes. While these plans have strong community support, having been generated through community input, we have come to the realization that we cannot begin many of these projects and ideas without first clearing the space to develop them.

In the next 4 months our group plans to initiate community clean-up efforts in the following areas:

1. Clear all scrap metal from existing lots within the boundaries of the town of Lodge Grass. The majority of this scrap metal is resulting from burned and abandoned mobile homes.
2. Clear all trees deemed dangerous or that hinder lots from being developed and landscaped for homes or businesses.
3. Level the ground on lots that are currently inhospitable to new housing.
4. Properly dispose of remaining in-ground foundations for demolished homes and buildings and prepare these lots for development as parks, homes, or businesses.
5. Remove and dispose of all surrendered junk vehicles.
6. Clear trash and establish a normal, accessible, and established policy for trash disposal.
7. Begin landscaping and improvements of individual lots owned by community members who join the "Together We Are Raising Lodge Grass" collective. This may require demolition, digging lines for sewer or water, removal of construction debris, etc.
8. Establish a facility where residents can rent (cash or timeshare) basic yard and home maintenance equipment.

Our team has a number of professionals who can perform heavy equipment operations, metal cutting, construction, and logging duties, but we lack the equipment in Lodge Grass to carry out these plans in a timely and cost-effective manner. A total of \$2000 of our grant can be spent on these activities so our resources are limited to providing our own labor and seeking contributions of time and equipment from others.

In the process of our community interviews, we learned about past opportunities offered by the Coal Board to support Lodge Grass that were sadly passed up. The Lodge Grass community was therefore unable to benefit from your partnership and generosity to make much-needed improvements. At this time we would like to appeal to your members to ascertain if there may be resources we could now access as an established community group, capable of carrying out significant positive change in a responsible, and accountable way. I believe you will find that our leaders have a great deal of integrity and will manage any support you are able to provide with care and frugality and also deep gratitude. Thank you for considering our request for assistance on behalf of the Lodge Grass community and Raising Places – Lodge Grass.
